## Purpose

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Office of Law Enforcement in Virginia ensures compliance with federal wildlife laws that protect threatened and endangered species, migratory birds, certain marine mammals, fisheries and native species. It also carries out U.S. enforcement obligations under international agreements. These laws and agreements include:

## Enforcement Activities

- Investigate alleged violations of federal fish and wildlife laws protecting migratory birds, bald eagles and endangered species.
- Investigate illegal interstate commerce in fish and wildlife and related products, and fish and wildlife deaths caused by contaminants.
- Work undercover; conduct surveillance, make arrests and prepare cases for court.
- Assist in resolving law enforcement problems on national wildlife refuges.
- Work in cooperation with state and other enforcement agencies.
